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The Way Forward – Stakeholder Considerations

- Develop a *clear vision in consultation* with stakeholders
- **Collaborate** with state and international agencies to ensure alignment and integration
- Need for a **common language** and set of definitions
- A consistent set of **data definitions** is required
- Determine *current state of play* in terms of digital capabilities
- Ensure alignment and connectivity of future systems
- Some digital systems require significant attention including, VLE, CRM, data security, research repositories



The Development Process

Establish a steering group to lead the development and roll out of the digital transformation framework led by the HEA and HEAnet which includes relevant stakeholders and international experts

Proposed Work Programme

- With a view to informing the framework perform an analysis of the current state of play in terms of available technologies and associated initiatives
- Perform review of good practice examples in other jurisdictions
- Create a shared vison for a digital transformation framework which facilitates stakeholder involvement in the implementation of the framework
- Create digital transformation framework which includes clear timelines , responsible agencies and areas of action
- Monitor the implementation and measure the output and impact of the digital transformation framework over a 5-year timeline

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Impact of Covid 19

- Work on formulating a framework was overtaken by impact of Covid 19
- All HE activity which could went on-line
- New work practices and learning approaches were adopted almost overnight
- Impact on learning experience and working arrangements has yet to be determined
- No doubt there will be a greater emphasis on blended learning going forward
- Approach to the development of a framework will change



Policy Development Activities – Post Covid19

- Finalisation of a digital transformation framework more important and relevant than ever
- Will need to include lessons learner from the impact of Covid I 9 – student experience
- Commitment to up front investment
- Impact of Covid19 will also be relevant to other policy and strategy development activities including
- Lifelong learning improving participation through blended and on-line approaches
- Work based learning, reskilling and upskilling
- Internationalisation blended mobility opportunities
- Public service staff contracts and operations
