Junior Enterprises are similar to real companies, with the main goal of enhancing the learning of their members through practical experiences.

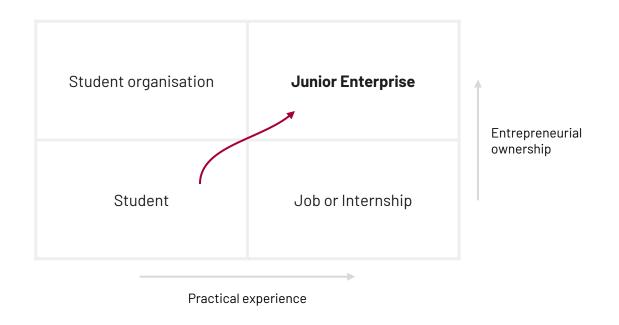

trainings in multicultural environment.

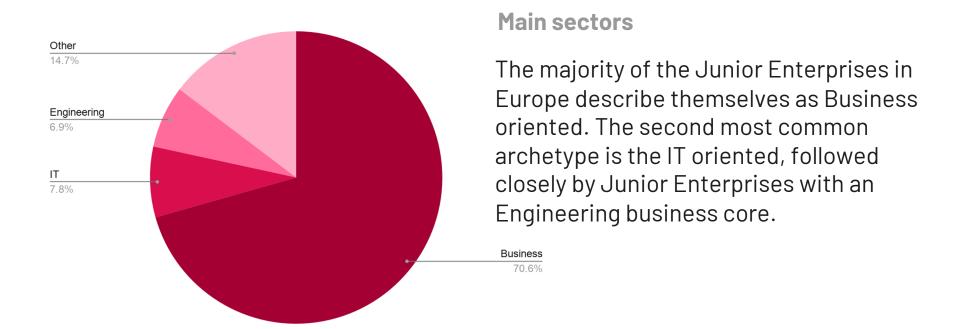
The program includes a training week delivered by experienced trainers to complement students academic experience with a non-formal education

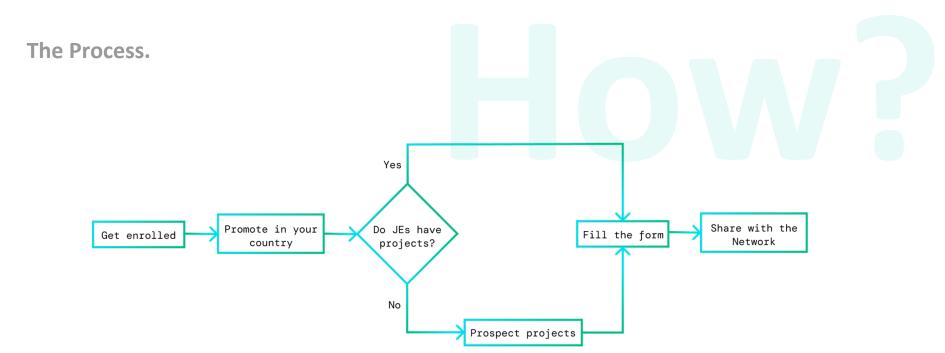
Why 1000?
